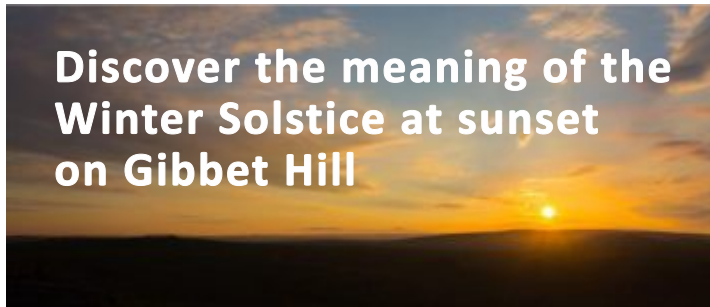

Discover the meaning of the Winter Solstice at sunset on Gibbet Hill



Friday 21st December 3pm
Reading Room and Gibbet Hill

Roger Page, one of the landowners of Gibbet Hill, has identified mounds which he has discovered line Gibbet Hill up with other major landmarks on the Summer and Winter Solstices. Come and hear about Roger's findings then, weather permitting, watch the sunset from the summit of Gibbet Hill.

We'll start in the warmth of the Reading Room with tea and a traditional yule log cake at 3pm to hear all about Roger's research and look at maps and diagrams, then go up onto Gibbet Hill to be there by 4.15pm ready for the sunset. If needed we can provide transport a large part of the way in 4x4 vehicles. Dogs welcome on Gibbet Hill but possibly not in the Reading Room. Bring a torch as it'll be dark on the way down.

The word 'solstice' comes from the Latin solstitium meaning 'Sun stands still' because the apparent movement of the Sun's path north or south stops before changing direction, and there are many ancient monuments and features which record and celebrate this change - perhaps Gibbet Hill was just such a special place at one time.

And he's ready to do the same again, or more, this winter if the weather demands it.

It was a very fruitful session with some good ideas, which the Trustees will be following up to consider how the projects can be taken forward, what finances are involved, and what grants could be sought.

- Garden trail, following the success of a previous village garden trail some years ago.

- Knotweed control on the Burrows and elsewhere.

- Progress possible footpath linking the school to the Recreation Ground.
- Improvement to Route 27 near the river.
- Improvements to children's play equipment and games courts.
- Bench on the summit of Gibbet Hill, plus interpretation board.

The discussions also included suggestions for bringing village groups together, working cooperatively. This will be considered although it was noted that such concepts may be outside the remit of the Jubilee Group.

Colouring Mary Tavy

The scheme to bring a lot of colour into Mary Tavy with daffodils along verges is moving forward with planting of bulbs next autumn.

In the meantime we'll be talking to Highways and applying for grant funding – and we need a small team of people to consider where to plant. Can you help?



Mary Tavy Garden Trail

Would you like to give the opportunity for others in Mary Tavy to see your garden? It doesn't matter if your garden is large or small, neat or wild, gardens are always fascinating.

Several years ago there was a very successful Mary Tavy Garden Trail, and three years ago or so we asked for people to consider opening their gardens for St. Luke's Hospice but we didn't get enough people wanting to take part. This time we're planning something on a very local and informal scale, we won't be advertising the Garden Trail beyond Mary Tavy so this is all about the community. A nice opportunity for local people to spend time with neighbours and have a cream tea or cake.

There is no specific time scale in mind - it might be this summer it might not be until the following year - so all we want now is to start making up a list of those who might like to take part.

Watching out for the community



There was a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme in Mary Tavy some years ago but, along with many other such schemes throughout the country, it fell by the wayside.

Neighbourhood Watch is now being revitalised, making more use of modern ways of communicating. There is a website and facebook page, online information packs and campaign toolkits, to help volunteers run awareness and prevention campaigns.

A Mary Tavy Neighbourhood Watch scheme has been registered but for it to be really effective it now needs a co-ordinator, someone who is keen to see the community kept safe and who would be willing to ensure that information is passed around. A letter to Jubilee News from the other side of the world

The Warne family in Australia

It was with great excitement that I read Ian Coleman's letter in the 23rd edition of your newsletter, earlier this year. In it he was asking for information about the Warne family of Mary Tavy. Over the past 8 years I have been working with other Warne cousins in Melbourne, Australia, to research our ancestors from Mary Tavy. The outline below explains our link to the area and to Ian.

* John Warne and Ann Newton brought their family from Cornwall to Mary Tavy in the early 1800s. John Warne was listed as a blacksmith aged 82 in the 1841 census.

* Two of their sons, James Warne who married Melora Thomas in 1823, and Francis Warne who married Jane Samspon in 1820, have descendants who migrated to Australia. We have connected with 5th cousins through these brothers.

* James and Melora's son James 1828-1876 married Maryann Spencer (also from Mary Tavy) in 1847. Maryann was born in the poorhouse with no father named. Her mother Grace later married William Youlden. James and



Maryann settled in Maldon Victoria, Australia. There are many descendants of theirs here.

* James and Maryann Warne are my great, great grandparents. James brother is an Absalom Thomas Warne born 1831.

* His son, another Absalom Warne, born 1872 is Ian Coleman's great, grandfather.

* Ian and I along with other Warnes in Australia are 4th/5th cousins.

After contacting him we were able to share photos and information about our respective families.

Funnily enough another cousin and I had visited Mary Tavy on a road trip round England 4 years ago. We went into the local inn

and asked about the Warne family and were told that Bill and Mary used to own the hotel we were in. I couldn't make any connection then but after reading Ian's letter discovered that they are relatives of his and hence ours as well. Amazing!!!

We had a Warne reunion which had over 60 relatives attend. On the wall was displayed our Warne family tree showing the descendants from the Warnes of Cornwall and Mary Tavy.

During our research we've come across an old photo of a man on a donkey which could have been taken somewhere around Mary Tavy. We would greatly appreciate any details or ideas of where it was taken. Could the man be John Warne the blacksmith?

I have two bibles that came from Mary Tavy:

Francis, my great grandfather, the son of James and Maryann, was given a bible from the Wesleyan Chapel as a farewell gift when he came out with his mother in 1866.

The other was given to Francis from his grandmother Grace Spencer, Mrs Youlden.

Personal Advertisement by Roger Page (The Pool Guy)

This is an advertisement by Roger Page in a personal capacity and not acting as a member of the Parish Council.

I would like to congratulate the new organisers of the Bonfire Night celebrations. In spite of the dismal weather, a spectacular show delighted the somewhat diminished numbers of attendees.

The Parish Council has degenerated into a lethargic state, in advance of the Parish election next May. No new initiatives were brought to the November Parish Council meeting. This was very lucky as the financial management has become so inept that no money is now left in the budget for new projects or grants.

The monthly income of approx. £1200 is now less than the running costs of the Parish. Expenditure on salaries and village maintenance for October was over £1400, leaving nothing for other projects

other than dipping into savings. For comparison: one year ago the expenditure came to £430.

So what has happened? The inner circle of the Parish Council set up a Personnel Committee with secret agenda and minutes. They have decided to not replace the Clerk, but to employ a Locum Clerk which inevitably results in much higher unit costs and poor cost control on other services. Four councillors of the Personnel Committee decided not to attend two Financial Committee meetings rendering those meetings inquorate, which does not allow the meeting to take decisions to improve the financial control.

This means that the Parish Council has clearly decided not to adhere to the 2018/19 budget. As Chair of the Finance Committee, I have decided that my position is untenable and I have therefore resigned.

At the November Council meeting the Chair, who is in charge of the

Emergency Plan, stated that he would no longer be available to respond to flood emergencies on Brentor Road, as he has had so many callouts previously.

I have cleared the ditches on the moor to the north of Brentor Road, to carry as much water into the power station as possible and to relieve the drain which leads into the Burn. It will be some time before it settles down and I would ask walkers and riders to use the bridges and not destroy the new banking when crossing the leats.

In the Tavy Times some may have noticed letters encouraging parishioners to put themselves forward for election to the Parish Council. I encourage all those who can represent the diversity of interests and background in Mary Tavy to join me in seeking election in May 2019. If you need any help, please phone me, 810900.
