Extra Traffic through Mary Tavy?

Butcher Park Hill in Tavistock – the Brentor road – will be closed during development of the large site for housing on the edge of Tavistock. From Monday 11th February until Friday 17th May - or longer. The signed diversion will be via Lamerton. However many Brentor locals will probably use the route through Mary Tavy to get to Tavistock.

The plan had been for delivery vehicles to and from the site to use a route through Mary Tavy, on the A386 and along Station Road. The Jubilee Group and many individuals objected to this, but we haven't been able to find out whether those plans have changed.

The walkway that appeared then disappeared again

When Harrington Homes held their open day last summer people who visited learnt that a walkway between The Burrows and the lane leading to the Coronation Hall was part of the plans. This hadn't been on the original planning permission but had been put in as part of the later landscape proposals and supported by DNPA, to provide safety for the new residents going to and from the hall or Recreation Ground. Whilst some in the village very much favoured the walkway, some, including those on the committee for the Coronation Hall, objected; it was felt that this would lead to their car park being used inappropriately. The walkway has now been withdrawn from the plans.

Parish Council financial decisions

For the past three years the Parish Council decreased the precept – the part of the Council tax that pays for running parish services – by around 2% to 2.5% each year, whilst also matching the precept income to budgeted spending. However, at their January meeting the Parish Council agreed to set the precept at £16,689 for 2019/20, which when compared to £13,581 for 2018/19 is an increase of more than £3,000, almost 23%.

Also at their January meeting the PC decided to change the bank accounts for the PC, moving from TSB bank to Unity Trust Bank, at a fee of £18 per quarter. At the same time the cemetery accounts will be combined into the parish current and savings accounts.

At the February meeting the council will be considering the charges for cemetery services including burials.

Mary Tavy Community Composting Scheme

New residents of Mary Tavy may not be aware that the village has a community composting scheme. It is managed voluntarily by the Tavistock Green Umbrella Group (TGUG) and is supported by West Devon Borough Council. It is located in a field just to the north of the power station and to the west of St. Raphael, marked by a notice on the gate into the field which also contains two polytunnels.

The scheme is intended only for hedge trimmings, and we ask people to keep their own soft garden waste and kitchen waste and recycle it themselves. Inside the gate is one large bay waiting to receive your hedge trimmings, and below it are two other bays which are full and 'working'.

The scheme is as much a traffic reduction scheme as a recycling scheme. Before its existence many would fill cars and trailers with their hedge trimmings and drive five miles to the Crowndale site and five miles back; from Crowndale the waste was taken to Plymouth. Why waste so much petrol when you can wheel your barrow down to the village scheme?

We are able to give away the compost and are keen for users of the scheme to benefit in this way. Members of the TGUG process the waste once a year, filling around 200 bags each October or November and turning the pits. If you decide to make use of the scheme, we ask that you contact me so that we can arrange to be there when you deliver.

Finally, the volunteers of the TGUG believe strongly that residents of Mary Tavy who use the scheme should be aware that those who provide their considerable energy and time to process the compost do so voluntarily. If any Mary Tavy residents would like to offer their volunteer help for this annual expenditure of human energy, please contact me – your efforts will be very much appreciated.

Personal Advertisement by Roger Page (The Pool Guy)

This is an advertisement by Roger Page in a personal capacity and not acting as a member of the Parish Council.

The New Year is the time to review the previous year's successes and notable events. Turbulent times at the beginning of the year continued throughout 2018.

The Parish Council became divided into two parties: originally over the proposed inscription on a gravestone. Inflexibility by the Council on whether the words met the criteria outlined in the Cemetery rules, led to petitions being presented to the Council and an article in the Tavistock Times. Eventually, a compromise was agreed.

One month later the Council was presented with an

allotment deal arranged between the Trustees of the Recreation Ground and the Allotment Association. The two groups, who were represented on the Council by three individuals, demanded that the Parish Council paid for a bespoke fence and then voted that the maintenance costs of this fence should also be borne by the Council.

This created a major rift, as no security on the destination of the money could be obtained.

In the midst of this, the Council Clerk resigned for personal reasons, closely followed by a locum Clerk for unknown reasons. A second locum clerk was installed with no advertisement or interview and with an ongoing cost double that of a permanent clerk. Her position has been confirmed until the elections in May 2019.

In the meantime two vital sub-committees (planning and finance) have been abolished. These areas are no longer scrutinised in order to spend wisely and to work meticulously for the Parish in planning matters.

On the positive side, a gritter was purchased in February to keep the roads open during the Beast from the East in March.

New Council Elections are scheduled for May, and it is essential that we have some new Councillors to bring forward new useful initiatives for Mary Tavy. You have the right to determine what happens to some of your taxes. We would like your help to give Mary Tavy a great community spirit and give help to those who need it.
