#### **Norman Stanley Fry**

Petty Officer Stoker 299469, H.M.S. Falmouth, Royal Navy. Killed or died as a direct result of enemy action at the Battle of Jutland 19 August 1916, aged 32.

Born at St Dominick, Cornwall in 1884. Brother of Edward Charles Fry, of Moorside, Brentor, and also brother of, Mrs Alice M. Ball. Station Rd, Mary Tavy.

Buried at sea. Commemorated on Plymouth Naval Memorial.

#### **Despatch Box** News from the Parish Council

Mary Tavy Parish Council have been particularly pro-active and community focused recently. Two working groups, aptly known as 'speeding' and 'verges,' have been set up by keen councillors to have in-depth discussions on related issues, explore potential solutions, consider financial constraints and create proposals to present to the full council at meetings.

The 'speeding' working group intend to enhance road safety for the benefit of all within the community and the 'verges'

working group ultimately aim to make the best use of public funds by re-structuring the Parish Council's grass, verge and cemetery maintenance programs.

The Parish Council wish to promote openness and community engagement with its parishioners. It is wonderful when parishioners attend our meetings and get in contact by email. In the spirit of promoting a sense of openness, I feel that it would only be fair to warn you that there *may* be a rise in Council Tax for the

financial year 2020-21. This would be due to West Devon Borough Council's intended withdrawal of the annual Council Tax Support Grant (a vital source of our funds) from 2020 onwards. Please be assured that the Parish Council intend to do all it possibly can to avoid passing this cut in funding on to parishioners.

# Dartmoor Junior Rangers helping to clear pond vegetation at the Power Station





The young people in these pictures are Junior Rangers undertaking some practical conservation work at Mary Tavy Hydroelectric Power Station recently, with local Dartmoor Ranger Rob Taylor.

There has been an increase in unwanted vegetation over the last couple of years in and around the pond area and the group were tasked with clearing some of it. Rob tells us that "Any excuse to get some waders on, all six really enjoyed themselves clearing the majority of Bogbean to allow the water lily to grow unimpeded, and reducing some of the grass encroachment, as well as clearing around the small island."

Once they had finished the task, they made three bird boxes to be put up around the area, and were treated to a tour of the Power Station in the afternoon by Site Manager Karl Jones.

DNPA run three Ranger clubs for children, the Ranger Ralph Club, Junior Rangers and Youth Rangers. Each of the groups has an age range, the idea being that children start as Ranger Ralphers and progress through Junior and Youth Rangers as they get older. Through this they become more involved with practical tasks, there is a greater emphasis on

learning National Park values, ethos etc, their depth of learning grows as they become older and more experienced, and they have the opportunities after a few years to achieve additional accreditations such as the John Muir Award and the National Outdoor Learning Award.

# **Speeding and Road Safety**

At their August meeting the Parish Council set up a Working Group to look into issues concerning speeding and road safety, and this group has now met twice and has various ideas in mind which it is currently following through.

It is proposed there will be new speed detection signs which will capture data which can be forwarded to the Police. They are also seeking to introduce a 'village identity' by use of gateways, into which investigations are continuing.

Another of the schemes being considered is the revitalisation of the Mary Tavy Community

Speedwatch scheme, which had been active but which ultimately failed due to insufficient willing volunteers. Through a recent message on the Brentor, Lydford and Mary Tavy facebook hub several new volunteers have already put their names forward. If you would like to add your name to the list to help with this important task, please give your name and contact details to Michael Fife Cook, michael@stannary.co.uk, 810897. Volunteers will be fully trained and work as a team to monitor speeds and issue warnings which can be followed up by the Police. ## **Verges and Maintenance**

The Verges and Maintenance Working Group of the Parish Council is considering what areas around the village need to be included in a regular maintenance schedule which will form part of a new three year contract.

The council would like to know what parishioners think are important areas in the village for grass cutting, how they feel about the concept of 'wilding' of verges, and their views on grass cutting and maintenance in the cemetery.

This will be discussed at the next Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 8th October. The open session at 7pm is an opportunity for parishioners to put forward their views.

#### **Our Telephone Boxes**

Every few years, BT has been putting forward proposals to remove or take out of service some or all of the three telephone kiosks in Mary Tavy. There has been a recent consultation which lists two of our three phone kiosks for possible removal, the one at Horndon and the one near the War Memorial.

The phone kiosk near the Church is a listed building, a K2 kiosk designed by Giles Gilbert Scott in the 1920s; although listed it is nevertheless possible the

telephone could be removed from the kiosk, but it is not mentioned on the BT consultation list.



The Scone Box, a lovely little cake shop at Eworthy near Germansweek.

In the past the Parish Council, the Jubilee Group and others have objected to the proposals to remove any of the kiosks. However with improved mobile phone coverage, at their September meeting the Parish Council resolved that they were happy for the two kiosks to be removed.

It is possible for either or both of those kiosks to be put to other use by 'adopting' a kiosk, which can only be done by a local coiuncil or a charity. The Jubilee Group could consider adopting a kiosk if there is an individual or group who would like to use it as something like

a bookswap, a plant shop, or there are dozens of other possibilities. Google 'adopt a kiosk' for ideas.
