

## **Garages or houses?**

The planning application to develop the garage site of C J Down Coaches has been withdrawn. This doesn't, however, mean that development won't take place at some time. In the meantime it's great to see the site looking so smart.

Blackdown Garage, known to many of us as Ken Body's garage, is currently up for sale as a development site. It has already had a couple of owners since the garage closed in 2005.

It is being sold with planning permission for 21 homes, 19 on the main site (see the street view above as well as the plan below), plus a pair of semi-detached affordable rented dwellings on the land to the north known as Grace and Favour. In total it is 1.43 acres. The sale price is £550k.

It is noted in the sale particulars that the site is contaminated with mine spoil as well as a fuel tank in situ, plus Japanese knotweed.

When it sells we have arranged with the agent to take the tyres and plants, which we will site elsewhere in the village.

#### From the War Memorial: J/4332 Able Seaman Henry (Harry) Thomas Andrews

Harry was drowned, aged 24, when HMS Tipperary was sunk with the loss of 185 hands at the Battle of Jutland on 1st June 1916. His widow Kathleen lived at 4 Fairfield, Bal Lane. Jutland was the largest naval battle in the War.

## Mary Tavy Parish Council

Amendments to our Standing Orders have produced a major change to "Parishioners' Time" held prior to the start of a monthly Council meeting. Parishioners may now raise any item relevant to the business of the Parish Council. This opportunity is, for practical reasons, still limited to a maximum of 5 minutes per person and 15 minutes of discussion time in total. We are always pleased to hear of your concerns and we will deal with issues that you raise as quickly as possible. Parishioners may also bring their concerns to the attention of the Parish Clerk or directly to a Council member.

Parishioners will be pleased to hear that our new clerk, Mrs. Kerri Higham, has survived the baptism of fire of working with the 5 very disparate members of the Council!! As well as establishing a good working relationship she has scored a notable victory in successfully pursuing a claim for refund of VAT from HM Customs and Excise. This claim, which covered the period of September 2012 to August 2015, should result in a repayment of £1243. Unfortunately we were unable to reclaim a further £45 as the payments concerned occurred outside the maximum reclaim period of the previous 3 years. It is hoped that savings such as this will allow us to restrict next year's precept demand.

Investigative research into the cemetery extension proposed by the previous Council continues. We thought that definitive guidance on boundary construction had been secured from the DNPA. However, it now appears that this is only "Best Advice" and that other options may be possible. A conclusion can only be obtained through a formal Planning Application which we have always seen as a final stage only undertaken once all relevant issues have been resolved. This seems to be a case of "one step forward and two backwards." However we are delighted to have received an offer of assistance from the Principal of a parish based quantity surveying practice, Mendax Ltd. We can only hope that with their support and advice we can make greater progress with this project. A formal progress report was also considered this month in which an assessment had been made of the size of the proposed extension site. Initial capacity claims made by the previous Council have proved to be optimistic in the extreme and further negotiations with SW Water over size will have to take place. We hope to make a public presentation on this complex and expensive proposal early in the New Year.

I have been asked to remind all parishioners who visit family graves in the Parish cemetery of the regulation which bans the use of glass containers to hold floral tributes. The contractor employed by us to maintain the cemetery has reported that he was very fortunate to have escaped serious injury when a glass container shattered during the strimming of grass around a grave. As this is a serious Health & Safety issue we are required to take immediate remedial action. Therefore it is our intention to remove glass containers from the cemetery without further notice or discussion. We of course prefer to administer the cemetery with the cooperation and support of the community and we ask you all to assist us in dealing with this difficult matter.

Councillors have also expressed concern on behalf of several parishioners over the disposal or continued retention of documents and photographs donated to the now defunct Mary Tavy Historical Society. The Society which existed between 2007 and 2013 set itself up to collect information relating to the history of our Parish for the benefit of future generations and to make the resulting archive available to the public. The level of achievement of this short-lived Society is unclear but a level of dissatisfaction appears to exist within the local community. As MTPC made significant grants to this organisation we believe we have an obligation to investigate. Therefore, any resident or past member with information about donated and unaccounted-for documents is asked to contact the Parish Clerk so that a register may be compiled. On receipt of such information all necessary measures will be taken to bring matters to a satisfactory conclusion.

Local organisations should be aware that we are currently discussing new arrangements and rules regarding the award of grants and donations from Council funds. Councillors are very aware that they are obliged to take all possible measures to ensure that awards are fully justified and that recipients make full and proper use of the funds provided. Organisations which fail to use such funds within an approved time-period or for the stated purpose are likely to be required to return the money as are those which cease to operate within the community. The Council of course can offer no guarantee as to the likely scale of provision for grants and donations in the coming months. Prudence is always our watchword when dealing with public funds.

trying to contact the local area referred to so that we can pass it to them, as it was passed to us.


