Great news: we now have approval from Devon County Council to rent a piece of land owned by them for a peppercorn rent. The land is situated fairly centrally with easy access, and we're looking forward to gathering the people-power to prepare the land and begin planning, planting, creating and growing!

- *Could you start growing seedlings for us? Or if you're already growing could you nurture and donate your excess? If you're limited on space we have access to polytunnels.*
- *Do you have seeds you've saved or bought that we could use?*
- *Do you have tools/shed/other equipment that we could use?*

The aim is to grow fruits and vegetables along with other decorative plants;

Sharing of work, space and produce;

Working together to create a social space for all of the village to use;

Including villagers of all ages, with a special link to the Mary Tavy and Brentor School;

Whilst preparing for the meeting in late November we felt that History Group was perhaps not the ideal name and a better one would be the Heritage Group. Heritage encompasses not just our history but how the past has shaped the village and our lives.

The meeting of the Jubilee Group's Heritage Group was well attended despite atrocious weather. Gerry Sargent, who had so generously donated his village history collection, was there and talked of some of his memories of living in the village.

His collection was laid out on tables for everyone to look through, and in one corner we had a rolling video display of photographs taken for the Tavistock Times by Jim Thorington in the 60s & 70s.

There were a lot of trips down memory lane.

Following that meeting many very valuable contacts have been made, particularly on the mining history, and there have been promises of additional items to add to our collection.

We've received information from two local people about some of the characters mentioned in the poem we reproduced in the previous Newsletter.

The Heritage Group is going to be working alongside the Footpath Working Group to provide information for the maps and information boards.

Updating Gerry Sargent's book is about to get underway, with some re-writing by Michael Cook.

The state of our Phone Boxes

In the parish we are fortunate to have the old-style red BT phone boxes. We have three - one by the war memorial, one near the church and the other at Horndon. All of them have flaking paint and are in a pretty poor state of repair.

The Jubilee Group has been in touch with BT and has arranged for each of them to be painted. This will be happening between March and October this year.

What we're not able to find out is whether the team will do any more than just painting, so we might need to do a bit more to ensure they are generally clean and pleasant to use.

Over the weekend of 16 and 17 March DNPA will be running a stone walling course near the Miners Dry field between Mary Tavy and Horndon. It will involve pulling down and rebuilding a section of the wall adjacent to the Public Footpath between the Elephants Nest and the Church.

The event is free and will be led by Dave Hannaford, and the land owners will be providing pasties and hot drinks over the weekend. This will be an interesting and enjoyable weekend and a great chance to learn about and get experience of this local skill.

Mapping our Paths and our Past

The Jubilee Group's Footpath Working Group has been exploring various options for producing a map of footpaths and bridleways around the Parish, including recommendations for a number of circular walks.

We've had a very productive meeting with Dartmoor National Park Public Rights of Way Team who have provided us with large scale OS maps so that we can plot some walks.

We plan to include written information alongside the maps, to enhance the walks with details of our mining heritage, local geology and landmarks.

We will be able to produce the maps ourselves, in full colour and on A3, even using waterproof paper. This means we'll be able to have them available reasonably quickly, we'll be able to print exactly the numbers required, and the cost will be as low as possible.



Looking to the future, we hope to be able to place information boards along walks, to help interpret what you can see around you, and DNPA have told us they would consider backing the development of new paths in and around Mary Tavy.

Would you like to be involved in this project, to help walk the walks, write-up the information, take photographs, create artwork, or more generally be part of the planning?

Would you like a Bus Shelter?

Those of you who use the bus stop going south on the A386 by the corner of Station Road will know all too well that there is no shelter from the weather. In the Community Plan in 2008 this was highlighted as an item for action.

Recently the Jubilee Group has undertaken some research and sounded out the various agencies involved, and it does appear that placing a simple shelter there would be possible and not prohibitively expensive.

Because of planning implications we hope the Parish Council will agree to be involved with us on this project. We are at an early stage in the process and have not yet got full costings or worked out all the details of construction and responsibilities. We anticipate we will need to seek grants to cover the costs.



Speedwatch Update

Only 3 people have so far come forward to help with the Community Speed-watch scheme, which may not be enough to maintain it. If you are concerned about road safety and care about vehicles speeding in Mary Tavy this is one way you can do something about it and your support would be much appreciated.

The commitment is not onerous, perhaps a couple of hours a month, especially if there is a reasonable pool of volunteers. You wouldn't be on your own as the system works in small teams. The process of becoming a volunteer takes a while, so the sooner we have new volunteers the better.
