



### Will there be floods and snow?

There has in recent years been flooding in Mary Tavy, mostly excessive rain water coming off the moors onto the roads, and sometimes into people's houses.

The Parish Council is carrying out leat inspections to ensure rain water is channelled appropriately, so we may avoid future floods. But it's definitely worth being prepared –

Empty sandbags, 10 per household, can be collected from WDBC offices, and sand bought from a builders merchant. For emergencies the Parish Council holds filled sandbags.

West Devon Borough Council was involved with offering Government assistance and grants for the floods last winter, and a similar programme of help may be available if there is general flooding again this winter.

We are fortunate to have our main roads gritted but there have been news stories stating that local councils, groups or individuals may have to do more of their own gritting this winter. Some parishes are prepared with portable grit spreaders. Mary Tavy Parish Council holds a store of rock salt but currently has no equipment.

They have a regular bus run Monday to Friday which covers Tavistock and surrounding areas, with buses currently scheduled for Mary Tavy on Mondays and Tuesdays. The return fare is  $\pounds$ 2.30.

Ring and Ride is supported by DCC, WDBC, Tavistock Town Council and the local parishes.



# **A Letter from the Recreation Ground**

Dear Villagers,

The Trustees of the Mary Tavy Recreation Ground had a difficult decision to make recently regarding a huge limb of the beech tree which was overhanging the changing rooms. The law on trees in a Conservation Area states that a dead, dving or dangerous tree can be taken down without prior approval, and we felt the limb did cause a serious danger. We had builders due to work on the roof, we regularly have 22 people using the changing room, and we felt we had no alternative but to remove the limb. It was found that the 4.5 ton limb was rotten. but we were nevertheless rapped over the knuckles by the planning authority. Public safety is our main responsibility, and we feel we took the appropriate action to protect the users of the changing rooms.

The refurbishment of the changing rooms – including some internal works, painting and a completely new roof – has been made possible thanks to a generous community grant from Biffa. It will give us peace of mind, knowing that the changing rooms are dry and safe, and it won't be necessary to close them in wet weather!

We have completed the new shelter in the play area, so people now have somewhere to rest or to go when the heavens open.



We are currently fundraising so that we can replace the swings that were fire damaged by vandalism. Keeping the Recreation Ground in good order is expensive, with insurance costing £700 a year, plus the costs of grass cutting and other maintenance.

We are very lucky that people with vision and a concern for the future decided, in 1946, to buy the field for the parish. It is certainly one of the main assets of the community, yet villagers may not realise that the Recreation Ground receives no general funding from public funds. It is unfortunate that this year the Mary Tavy Parish Council voted to refuse our application for a small grant.

The Trustees would like to thank the very many other volunteers and members of the public who give us their support in a variety of ways, including attending the events we organise to raise funds to help maintain this valued facility.
