
Following another successful Bonfire Night last November, we're already making arrangements for this year.

The Kid's Play Area will be open again soon

A year ago the play area in the Recreation Ground was closed following vandalism, the swings having been badly burnt. There has also been the need for quite a lot of maintenance work, but the Recreation Ground Trust didn't have sufficient funds to undertake all the work so the Play Area has remained closed.

There are now plans for all the work to be done and for the Play Area to be opened again. A request for a grant from the Parish Council was submitted in September but hasn't been decided on yet, although the Council has indicated that if any grant is given it won't be for the full amount requested.

The Jubilee Group will be making a donation towards the costs, sponsorship is being requested from local businesses, and a programme of fund-raising has been set up. The poster reproduced on the left is for a fun Community Supper which is one of the fund-raising projects being run by the Trustees of the Recreation Ground.

The Jubilee Group is setting up a crowd-funding appeal - anyone with a computer can make a pledge online, and depending on the amount pledged there are rewards. Take a look at www.crowdfunder.co.uk and search for Mary Tavy. We hope to have the appeal active within a week.

Footpaths Working Group Get involved with some new footpath projects

I hosted a training day for my counterparts in the Ranger Service. We were looking to head up over Sourton Tors to the Rattlebrook Track, onto Bleak House and a more ankle friendly return along the *Granite Way. That morning* saw quite a significant snow covering along the Northern fringes of the moor, so after a quick discussion we opted instead for a walk and talk around Mary Tavy, looking at some of the projects I have been involved in over the last couple of years, some exciting opportunities coming up, as well as a quick tour of the Hydro Station.

On the subject of Mary Tavy
Hydro our Ranger Ralph club
met there last week to learn
all about the way the moor
provides energy for the local
population. They learnt about
the Mine leat, how important
a good head of water is when
converting water to electricity,
and they even made their own
Pelton Wheels and tested them
in the leat. All rounded off with
their first barbecue of the year,

courtesy of DNPA resident chef for the afternoon, me! Thanks go to Karl and his team at the power station, and Lydford Farm Shop for the excellent sausages. Our Ranger Ralph club is run by DNPA Education Service and facilitated by the Ranger Service. Please look at our website for more details.

I have a plan in mind to try and recruit a small team of likeminded individuals to volunteer to help in a series of tasks over the coming year. I have some tasks in mind; they all involve working outside, will be quite varied in nature and will cover the parishes along the northern Dartmoor boundary between Peter Tavy and Sourton. I will be working with the Mary Tavy Jubilee Group and Voluntary Wardens as a core group of people supporting.

So for those who may be interested in taking part please bear the opportunity in mind if you fancy a bit of fresh air, a great view and a good night's sleep at the end of the day. Details of the first task will be available soon, so keep a look out on the local notice boards.

Housing in Brentor

The need for affordable homes in Brentor was identified a few years ago and originally 9 possible sites were identified, and a shortlist drawn up. The Parish Council put the War Memorial site at the top of their list of preferred sites. When an application was made for 12 affordable homes on a site at Hammer Park, a hold was put on consideration of other sites.

In January DNPA Development & Planning Committee refused the application for outline planning permission for the Hammer Park scheme.

In mid-February DNPA Planning Officers and representatives from West Devon Borough

Council, Devon Communities Together and Brentor Parish Council held a special meeting to consider the way forward. At that meeting other possible sites within Brentor were reconsidered. However as DNPA had asked them not to progress their applications none were able to deliver development within a short time frame and therefore DNPA planning officers are now working with the Hammer Park site owner and his agent to develop a scheme which is more likely to gain approval.

The village is very much divided on this issue, with many local residents believing the Hammer Park site is not appropriate for the scheme because of access, in terms of it not being close to the centre of the village, the narrowness of the lane leading to the site and the destruction of an ancient hedge.

Stephen Belli, Director of Planning at DNPA wrote in a letter to Brentor Parish Council after the recent meeting "It was my understanding from the meeting that, following a good discussion, there was no overall dissent from the community for me to take forward further pre-application discussions with the owner of the Hammer Park site, such that a new planning application could be submitted as soon as possible for 10 units of affordable housing."


We have a competition every year for both billiards and for snooker, which runs from January through to April, for which all members are invited to participate.

The Annual Parish meeting is an opportunity for parishioners to hear reports from the Parish Council and other bodies, to ask questions and to hear from prospective councillors.

District and Local Council Elections

As well as the general election, Thurs 7 May is the date of district and local elections. Elections here will be for one councillor for the Mary Tavy Ward on West Devon Borough Council, and nine councillors for Mary Tavy Parish Council.

Mary Tavy now has only five councillors, five councillors having resigned during the current four year term with one co-option during that time. Whilst the council is legally able to operate with such a small contingent, it is certainly far from ideal.

A number of local people have indicated they might consider standing for the council and have asked if there could be a meeting so that they can chat with other potential candidates.

There will be an informal get-together for potential candidates for Mary Tavy Parish Council:

There will be no agenda and no leader of the meeting, it is just an opportunity to meet up.

WDBC are holding an information meeting for potential West Devon councillors on Mon 9 Mar, 6.30pm.

The nomination process opens on Thurs 26 March and closes at 4pm on Thurs 9 April.

Those who have been nominated are invited to address the Mary Tavy Annual Parish Meeting on Thurs 16 April.

Dear Villagers,

The Recreation Ground Trustees have a busy year ahead.

We applied for a grant from the Mary Tavy Parish Council to build a new set of swings to replace the wooden fire-damaged swings, and for other necessary improvements. Only one Councillor has been in favour of the full amount of the grant requested and one Councillor said he felt that older people in the parish wouldn't be happy that their precept was being spent on the young, but it is still hoped that a part of the funding might be received. The Trustees are making every effort to find other forms of financial support. The young people of the

parish deserve a decent, well-maintained play area.

The first part of the fund raising is our Community Supper on 21 March at 7pm at the Coronation Hall. We look forward to seeing many of you there.

Biffa, who kindly helped us to refurbish the changing room, have inspected the work done and were very pleased with the improvement.

The Trustees have offered to help the Coronation Hall resurface the ground around the parking and entrance area. The Coronation Hall and Recreation Ground



are two important charities in the parish and greatly benefit the community. Without them Mary Tavy would not be the same. We must all do all we can for the whole parish to enjoy.

Dartmoor National Park are giving us young trees to fill in any gaps and enhance the area and we are very grateful to the volunteers who are brightening the area with plants.

Our Country Fayre is on Sunday 9th August. We are able to organise the event OK, but we do need some extra help to make it run even better.

For your diary, Bonfire Night, run with the Jubilee Group, is on 1st November.




Proposed development on Downs Garage site


